Economic Development Background

PG&E's Economic Development Rate is authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission through 2017, subject to MW cap (first-come-first-serve).

Community Benefits:

- Attracting or Retaining Companies in California
- Creating or retaining jobs
- Adding tax base for local communities
- Lowering electric rates
- Encouraging entrepreneurship
- Encouraging energy efficiency



Economic Development Rate Qualifications

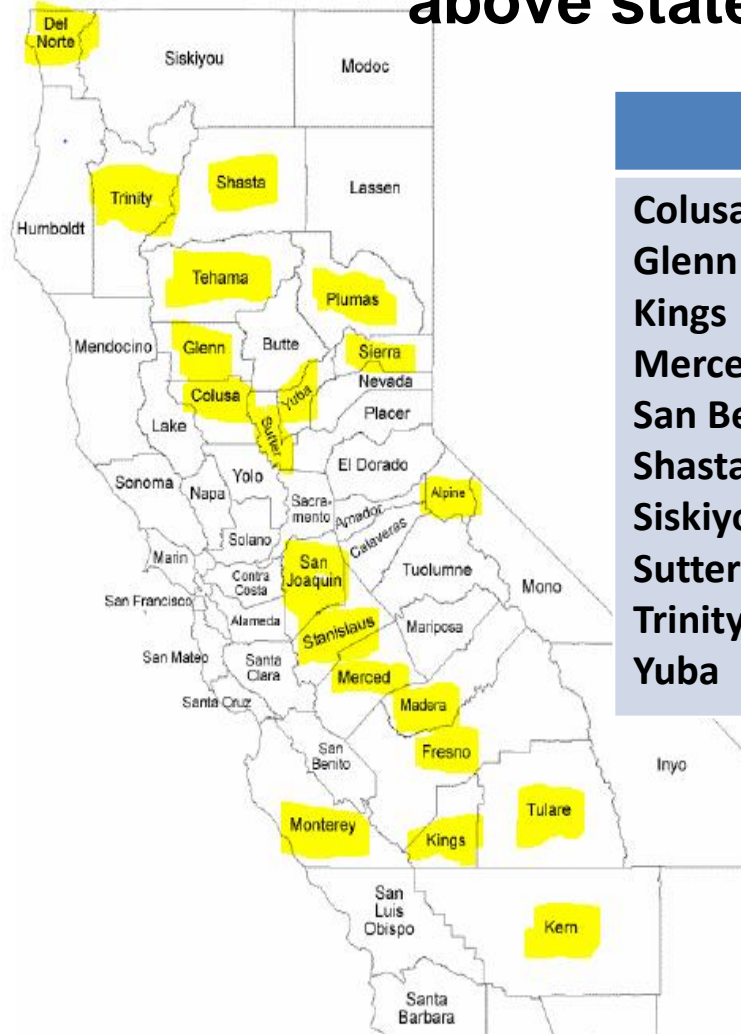
A 12% or 30% discount on electric portion of customer's bill for 5 years. To be eligible for the Economic Development Rate (EDR), a business must:

- 1 Be a qualified **BUSINESS TYPE** , most commercial/industrial customer qualify. Not eligible: retail, government, schools, or agriculture (food processors allowed).
- 2 Have a minimum **ELECTRIC LOAD** of 200 kilowatts
- 3 Take service on eligible **ELECTRIC RATE SCHEDULE**, A-10, E-19, or E-20
- 4 Studied **OUT-OF-STATE LOCATIONS** for either new facilities or relocation. Customer signs an affidavit affirming that *but-for* the EDR (and other allowable factors), the business *would not have located or moved out of California*
- 5 Obtain **Governor's Office for Business Development approval**

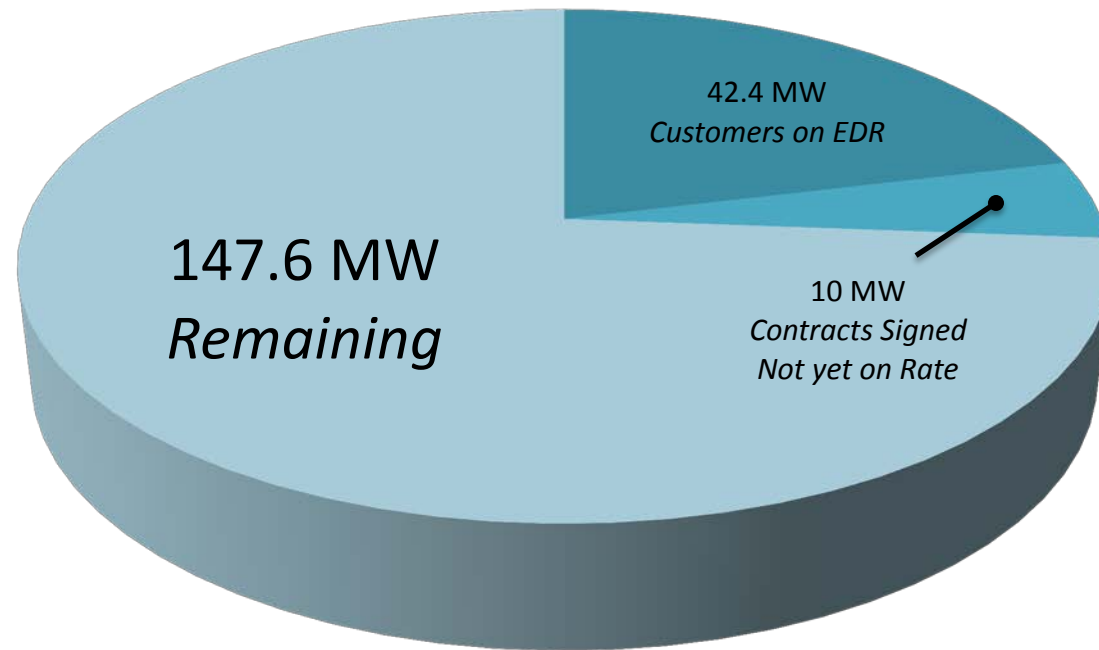
